NEWS FROM CITY HALL

Winter Tax Bills have been mailed to all property owners and taxpayers. State law requires property owners receive a copy of the tax statement. Those paid via escrow will have a notation in the upper, left-hand corner of the owner's copy of the tax bill.



Winter tax payments are due by February 14, 2022 at 5pm.

Any payments received after close of business will be considered late, including online payments or those deposited in the drop-box after

hours. Please note, it is the property owner's responsibility to ensure taxes are paid and non-receipt of the bill does not negate the requirement to pay. Blight, Weeds, or Junk Vehicles Properties must be kept in good repair, including exterior siding and roofs, and free of junk/debris. Additionally, city code states that vehicles must be registered and operable.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS

In 2019, a partnership of Charlotte Public Schools, Sparrow Hospital (formerly Hayes Green Beach), CanDo!, Barry Eaton Health Department, the Eaton County Road Commission, and the City, applied for funds through MDOT from the



Safe Routes to School grant program to construct certain infrastructure projects throughout the City, including sidewalks, crosswalks, and signage to enable and encourage children to safely walk and bike to school. In 2021, we received conditional approval of the \$1.3 million in grant funding and we are working on the pre-construction stage of this project. Crews have been out surveying and meeting with affected property owners. Look for more information later this year!

Assessing Update The Board of Review will be meeting on March 14 from 3:00pm to 9:00pm and March 15th from 9:00am to 3pm at City Hall for the purpose of hearing protests to the 2022 values as set by the Assessor. Appointments may be made after the Assessment Notices are received. Notices will be mailed by March 1st, 2022.

Any Veterans that are considered permanently and totally disabled may be exempt from property tax. Poverty exemption applications are also available from our office. If your household income is less than the Federal Poverty Guidelines you may qualify for a property tax exemption. Please contact our office for details. If you have been exempt in the past, please make sure you file the application as soon as possible. > From the Fire Chief Did you know that three out of five home fire deaths result from fires in properties without working smoke alarms? More than one-third (38 percent) of home fire deaths result from fires in which no smoke alarms are present. The risk of dying in a home fire is cut in half in

homes with working smoke alarms. Smoke detectors help save lives by warning residents of a fire in time to escape.

The Charlotte Fire Department will provide and install a free smoke detector for any qualifying Charlotte and surrounding Township residents living in a single-family or two-family residence. The department also will install replacement batteries in existing smoke detectors at no charge.

For a free smoke detector or to arrange to have the batteries in an existing device replaced, call 517-543-0241.



From the Police Chief Reminder—please do not park overnight on any city street or parking lot (except for permitted downtown residents). There is a city-wide ordinance prohibiting parking from 2am to 5am. Keeping streets clear is especially important in winter to ensure plows



can clear roads after snowfall.



NEWS FROM CITY HALL

Snow Removal Reminder. The streets in the city are plowed by City, ECRC, and MDOT crews, depending on jurisdiction. The effectiveness of the snow plow; however, is impacted greatly by the actions of property owners when moving snow out of their driveways and sidewalks. Please do not push, blow, plow, throw or otherwise place the snow in the street. Most importantly for the efficiency of our plows, do not push snow back into the street after the plow has been down your street. Pushing snow into the street is not only a safety concern, it's against our code of ordinances.

To help limit the amount of snow that ends up in your driveway, clear a section of the street along the curb before your driveway to create a place for the snow to end up. This will reduce the amount that ends up in front of your drive. If there is a hydrant in front of your home or business, please keep it cleared throughout the winter.



Sidewalks—Snow and Ice. The City has adopted an ordinance that requires property owners keep sidewalks clear of ice and snow. Property owners are required to clear the sidewalks within 48hrs of a snow or ice event. Please remove snow from edge to edge and from property line to property line including the entire approach to any crosswalks. Owners of corner lots must clear both frontage streets in their entirety. In addition, please do not push snow from the sidewalks into the crosswalk. Ensure that all crosswalks are clear and that pedestrians have a safe path from the sidewalk, without having to step over a pile of snow.



Guide to Frozen Water Services. Pipes or hoses exposed to the air will



freeze when the temperature reaches 32 degrees or colder. Water pipes buried in the ground are insulated from the freezing temperatures until the frost in the ground reaches the depth of the water pipes. The time it takes for the frost to reach buried water pipes varies greatly depending on snow cover, average temperatures and the type of

soil. One interesting fact is that when the sun shines during the winter months, it actually pushes the frost deeper before thawing begins. When water freezes in a pipe it expands and the expansion can result in a burst pipe. Letting a faucet drip during extreme cold weather can prevent a pipe from bursting. It's not that a small flow of water prevents freezing; this helps, but water can freeze even with a slow flow. Please call Public Works at (517) 543-8858 for more information.
