COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS Regular Meeting May 26, 2015

<u>CALL TO ORDER:</u> By Mayor Burch on Monday, May 26, 2015 at 7:00 p.m.

PRESENT: Councilmembers Baker, Dyer, Ridge, Johnston, Conway, Mayor Pro-Tem Sanders, Mayor Burch, City Clerk Terpstra and City Manager Guetschow.

The invocation was offered by Mayor Burch followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FOR REGULAR MEETING OF MAY 11, 2015: Mayor Pro-Tem Sanders moved, supported by Conway to approve the minutes of May 11, 2015 as presented. Carried. 7 Yes. 0 No.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Zachary Story, 105 ½ S. Cochran, Ste. B, addressed the council stating that he would like the street funding committee's recommendations. He would also like to see a presentation on the Sustainability Committee.

A. <u>PUBLIC HEARING HAZARD & NUISANCE SPECIAL</u> ASSESSMENT ROLL 2015-01:

Public Hearing Opened at 7:06 P.M.

Phil Berkompas, addressed the council in regards to the Special Assessment for 413 Pearl Street in the amount of \$144.15 for brush removal. Mr. Berkompas stated that a notice should have been sent before the brush was picked up. He stated that he did receive an invoice at the time but that he did not contact the City at that time.

Discussion was held on what type of notices are sent to property owners.

Mayor Pro-Tem Sanders moved, supported by Conway to approve Hazard & Nuisance Special Assessment Roll 2015-01 with the removal of 413 Pearl St. assessment for further investigation. Carried. 7 Yes. 0 No.

C. PUBLIC HEARING FY 2015/2016 BUDGET:

Public Hearing Opened: 7:19 P.M. There was no public comment.

D. <u>DISCUSS WATER/SEWER UTILITY RATE</u> RESOLUTION 2015-09:

Discussion was held on the cost of maintaining the water/sewer system and the need for the rate increase.

E. <u>DISCUSS RESOLUTION 2015-10 ADOPTING FY</u> 2015/2016 BUDGET:

City Manager Guetschow provided copies of the proposed DDA Budget and the proposed CARA Budget. He also provided a copy of the revised budget resolution including levying the 2 mills for the Downtown Development Authority.

Discussion was held on the 2 mills to be levied for DDA.

Discussion was held on bonding for parking lot improvements. It was the consensus of council to remove the parking lot bonding from the budget at this time.

F. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF MILLAGE AGREEMENT WITH EATON COUNTY ROAD COMMISSION:

City Manager Guetschow explained the agreement with the Eaton County Road Commission for Millage Revenue that was agreed upon by both the Eaton County Road Commission and the City of Charlotte.

Councilmember Conway moved, supported by Johnston to approve the agreement as written. Carried. 7 Yes. 0 No.

G. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF PROPOSAL FROM ROWE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES COMPANY FOR TENNIS COURT ENGINEERING SERVICES:

City Manager Guetschow explained that there were two proposals received for the tennis court engineering services. Rowe Professional Services Company was the low bid.

Councilmember Conway moved, supported by Dyer to authorize approval of the proposal from Rowe Professional Services Company in the amount of \$9,200.00. Carried. 7 Yes. 0 No.

H. <u>DISCUSSION REGARDING COUNCILMEMBER</u> <u>DYER'S PROPOSAL FOR DDA REVOLVING LOAN</u> FUND:

Councilmember Dyer stated that he would like to propose a revolving loan fund for the DDA District using some of the O-I settlement monies.

Discussion was held among councilmembers on the implementation of this type of revolving loan fund.

Zachary Story, 105 ½ S. Cochran, Ste. B, addressed the council on the costs of street repair. He also addressed the City Manager form of government vs. strong Mayor form of government.

Ben Phlegar, 425 Horatio, addressed the council on the City Manager form of government and on the City budget.

- Councilmember Dyer stated that he looks forward to exploring the idea of the Revolving Loan Fund for the Downtown Development Authority.
- Councilmember Conway thanked everyone who took part in the Memorial Day Parade and appreciates their service.

- Councilmember Johnston expressed interest in getting more information on the DDA Revolving Fund Loan program and possibly a model from other communities.
- Mayor Burch encouraged everyone to shop local and get out and enjoy Charlotte.
