Curbside Leaf and Yard Waste Collection

The Department of Public Works will be conducting the second spring leaf and brush curbside collection the week of May 2nd through May 5th. Please place leaves in brown, yard waste bags and stack any brush in neat piles at the curb. We cannot collect leaves in plastic bags. Please do not place dirt, rocks, or similar materials in yard waste bags. We cannot collect non-compostable materials. You may take your yard waste to the DPW Garage, Monday through Friday from 8am to 4pm. Saturday drop-off hours will resume on May 7th from 8am-11:30am.

Water Shut Off Program

The Council directed administration to resume the procedures outlined in City Ordinance to discontinue water service to customers due to non-payment in 2022. The City has included notices in city communications (e.g. city beat) and sent out a mailing to those customers who would be subject to shut off earlier this year. This was done to provide those customers with ample notice to contact the city, or other agencies if needed, for information and assistance in resolving the outstanding balance. Beginning with the April billing cycle, customers who do not pay their bill as required will be subject to shut-off for nonpayment. They will receive a second notice the first week of May. If payment is not made a final notice will be posted at their property 10 days later and shut off will occur 5 days following the final notice posting.

Assistance Programs

The State has announced another fund for assistance, the Michigan Homeowner Assistance Fund (MIHAF). The Homeowner Assistance Fund was established under section 3206 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (the ARP) to mitigate hardships associated with the coronavirus pandemic by providing funds to prevent homeowner mortgage delinquencies, defaults, foreclosure, loss of utilities or home energy services and displacements of homeowners experiencing financial hardship on or after January 21, 2020 or for those homeowners who experience a coronavirus pandemic financial hardship that began before January 21, 2020 but continued after that date. Safe Routes to Schools

In 2019, a partnership of Charlotte Public Schools, Sparrow Hospital formerly Hayes Green Beach), CanDo!, Barry Eaton Health Department, the Eaton County Road Commission, and the

City, applied for funds through MDOT from the Safe Routes to School grant program to construct certain infrastructure projects throughout the City, including sidewalks, crosswalks, and signage to enable and encourage children to safely walk and bike to school. In 2021, we received conditional approval of the \$1.3 million in grant funding and we are working on the preconstruction stage of this project. The documents have been sent to MDOT for bidding and we expect construction to begin in June or July. This project will take place over this summer and summer 2023 for completion.
