NOTICE is further given that at the regular City Council Meeting held Monday, April 17, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. the City Council of the City of Charlotte passed *Resolution 2023-07 "A resolution establishing regular elections in November of each even year commencing with the city election of November, 2026".*

To accommodate for the change from odd to even year elections, all terms of office for City of Charlotte Council seats are extended for one (1) year, one (1) time only. Six (6) Council seats that are open for election at the November 7, 2023 city election; Mayor, District 1 and 2 and an At-large seat each with a 5-year term and District 1 and 2 each with a 3-year (partial) term. One (1) At-Large seat that is not open for election in 2023 has been extended 1 year (exp. 11/9/2026).

Voting for <u>all_precincts</u> will take place at City Hall for the November 7, 2023 City Election. City Hall is located at 111 E Lawrence Ave. Voters who typically vote in another location will receive a mailed notice regarding the change.

Please note, this change is only for the November 2023 City Election.

Rave Alerts. The City of Charlotte is using Rave alerts! Get notified with important information about what is happening in the community such as street closures, water system work, or emergencies that may affect you. There are several ways to register: Text CHARLOTTE to 67283; Download the Smart911 app; or Register for a free and secure safety profile online at Smart911.com.

The City also sends out notifications specific to users by address, such as notices when quarterly utility bills are sent out. If you're already registered, make sure to update your profile address so you're receiving accurate information.





Lead Service Line Replacement. The City of Charlotte Department of Public Works (DPW) is verifying the material of water service lines throughout the City as a requirement of the 2018 Michigan Lead and Copper Rule. EGLE is requiring a complete inventory of the water service lines by January 1, 2025. The inventory must include material verification at 3 locations along the service line, including inside the home where the water service comes into the house. The City received a Grant from EGLE to help with

the material verification. Contact DPW at 517-543-8858 to schedule an inspection.

In place of an in-home inspection, a self-completed survey is available to residents which includes taking a picture of the water service line at the in-home water meter. Contact DPW at 517-543-8858 or edean@charlottemi.org to complete the self-survey of your home's water service.



Notice: Permit and/or Registration Required to Solicit or Canvass within City.

What is soliciting or canvassing?

Soliciting is to seek out sales for profit. A permit and registration is required, background check and fees apply.

Canvassing is to seek votes, contributions or sales for non-profits or to conduct surveys, or public discussions. Registration is required, but no fees apply.

Backyard Chickens. Did you know that backyard chickens are allowed in Charlotte if you obtain a permit? It's true - residents can keep up to 6 egg-laying chickens (No roosters!) in a coop and fenced enclosure after getting a permit from the City Clerk's Office.

The permit costs \$50 and is good for two years, after which it can be renewed for no charge. The permit is easy to obtain and the rules are easy to follow. This regulation only covers chickens,

however; it cannot be extended to other fowl, like ducks or geese, and it does not allow for the keeping of other farm animals such as rabbits or goats.

Blight, Weeds, or Junk Vehicles Warm weather means more time outdoors! It is also a great time for yard clean-ups and general outdoor property maintenance. Residents who have a concern about the condition of a specific property, because of an accumulation of junk, refuse, improperly stored recreational vehicles, or unregistered vehicles should contact Code Enforcement so it can be evaluated.

Properties must be kept in good repair, including exterior siding and roofs, and free of junk/debris. Additionally, city code states that vehicles must be registered and operable. Grass and vegetation be maintained so as not to exceed 10 inches in height. Residents who own larger lots in the city (5 acres or more) must also keep those areas within 100 feet of a street, alleyway or neighboring property line at 10 inches or less. Please keep shrubs and trees trimmed back at corners to prevent traffic hazards, and away from sidewalks for pedestrian safety.

A code enforcement inspector will take action on properties that are not maintained. Residents who are not mowing will be given notice of the violation and a reasonable time to remedy the problem. If the problem persists, the City may mow the lot and the homeowner will be charged for the work. Continued violations may result in the issuance of a civil infraction ticket.

From the Fire Chief Effective June 1st, 2023 residents in the City of Charlotte will no longer need to contact the Charlotte Fire Department to obtain a burn permit. Residents are permitted to have a recreational, cooking, or ceremonial fire any time of the year without a permit. Township residents may still be required to have a burn permit.

§3.3.226 Recreational fire. Fuel used for a recreational fire shall be untreated dry-season wood or charcoal. The total area for the fire shall not exceed 3 FT in diameter and 2 FT in height.

Burning of leaves, brush, yard waste, and trash is prohibited within city limits. Residents may be subject to a fire response charge if found in violation of city ordinance.

Michigan Homeowner Assistance Fund (MIHAF). The Fund was established under section 3206 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (the ARP) to mitigate hardships associated with the coronavirus pandemic by providing funds to prevent homeowner mortgage delinquencies, defaults, foreclosure, loss of utilities or home energy services and displacements of homeowners experiencing financial hardship on or after January 21, 2020 or for those homeowners who experience a coronavirus pandemic financial hardship that began before January 21, 2020 but continued after that date. Emergency Home Repair Program. Eaton County administers an Emergency Repair Program. No interest, no payment loans to Eaton County residents who meet federal, state and County Housing Program guidelines may be provided. This program assists with emergency repairs that are causing a health and safety risk to the occupants and the structure of the home.

The program offers up to \$20,000 in no interest, no payment loan assistance to repair and improve program participant's home. A deferred mortgage is recorded against the property for the amount invested into the home. 

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a federal program run by the FCC to assist qualifying low-income households pay for internet service and connected devices such as laptops or tablets. Households may be eligible if their income is below 200% the Federal Poverty Line or if someone in the household receives a government benefit such as SNAP, Medicaid, SSI, WIC, Pell Grant, or Free and Reduced-Proce Lunch. If eligible, households may receive up to a \$30/month discount on internet service, up to \$75 a month discount on qualifying Tribal lands, and a one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a copayment of more than \$10 but less than \$50). Michiganders in crisis now have an easy-to-remember three-digit number to call for help – 988. Michigan has joined the nation with 988, which will operate through the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline's network of more than 200 locally operated and funded crisis centers across the country.

In 2020, Congress designated the new 988 dialing code to operate through the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline to expand the existing support beyond people who are feeling suicidal to all individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis, including sub-

stance abuse issues. Trained counselors will be available 24/7 to field calls. They will listen to the caller's problems, assess their needs and provide support by connecting them with resources, and alert local emergency crisis teams, if necessary.

Anyone with these concerns can call, including mental health-related distress; thoughts of suicide; substance use crisis; or emotional distress. There are specialized services available for veterans, LGBTQ individuals and other groups. People who are worried about a loved one who may need support also can call.

The 988-dialing code does not replace the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline 800-273-TALK (8255) or other locally operated crisis lines. Instead, it serves as a universal entry point to connect individuals in need to trained crisis counselors who can help. MDHHS is working to ensure a solid infrastructure is built through coordination with 911 and other crisis service providers as the 988-dialing code launches.

Do I need a building permit for my home improvement project?

Depending on your project, whether it's performed by a contractor or you the homeowner, a building permit may be required. Understanding when a permit is required, and making sure to get one prior to starting can save a lot of time and trouble.

Many smaller projects do not require a building permit. These include fences, small accessory buildings, re-siding, re-shingling and window replacement. However, there are circumstances when the project must be reviewed for zoning compliance even when a building permit and inspections are not required.

For fences and shall sheds, city zoning approval is required even though a building permit is not. If more than two sheets of roof decking will be replaced during the shingling, or if window dimensions are changing, then a building permit is necessary. Larger sheds, garages and pole barns require zoning reviews, building permits and inspections.

Decks that are accessed by an exit door from your home (which is most decks), do require a building permit, even if they are not attached to the house. Interior remodeling projects usually require a building permit, but do not require a zoning review.

In most cases, permits and zoning reviews can be obtained very quickly and will not delay your project. However, failing to get a permit or allowing for an inspection can cause significant delays and even cost increases.




